"I'm still okay, still standing... albeit with a somewhat more - trusting- less agitated spirit. The winds are still howling, the fires of persecution are still raging against me, the floods are still threatening but I'm more at peace now...

I've been imprisoned now for almost 160 days

Lest you get the impression that I'm in total peace in jail and have my act altogether...NO! Odisha is almost at the bottom of India in most categories and I am in their prison system.

Each day I have to decide to make that day work and to conquer it in spite of the realities of life in jail; the deprivations, limitations, humiliations, restrictions and frustrations. My mantra: Endure hardships as a good soldier of Jesus Christ ... II Timothy 2:3

Never in my wildest imaginings did I see myself here at my age when all my classmates are retired and golfing, fishing, traveling or dead! And my fellow prisoners, who deeply love and respect me, all feel the same way too. They know all about me, for prison life has no secrets. They cannot fathom how I am here with my education, achievements and US citizenship. But it has pleased the father ...

However, the first still burns. Our best days are ahead. The cause --these kids-is ever present. This cause it is much bigger than us. The war will still rage on and the energy will not go away. But no, in all these things, we are more than conquerors through him who loved us and gave Himself for us.

The imperative to "Go and make disciples …" cannot be compromised. You do hold the ropes and I really am in the pits. Please don't let go of the rope. There is an innocent child at the other end that you cannot see.

1500 have graduated and made it but we still have miles to go before we sleep.

In the words of II Corinthians 4:8 Good News India has been pressed on every side but not crushed; perplexed but not in despair; persecuted but not forsaken struck down but not destroyed ..."
